

Arnold J. Holberg



Dr. Arnold J. Holberg, born in Oregon, Wisconsin, is a well-known and respected authority on asphaltic materials. He was educated at the University of Wisconsin, obtaining his doctorate in chemical engineering in 1937. His contributions to the development of asphalt technology have been significant and lasting in effect. He is the holder of 15 U.S. patents including those for catalytically-blown asphalt used as a membrane in paving and hydraulic applications, and patents for asphalt pipeline enamel. His papers and res mgs have been published extensively, and his literary works include editorship of a three-volume publication on bituminous materials, and a wealth of related articles and reports. Following post-doctoral research on bituminous materials at the University of Wisconsin, Dr, Holberg embarked on a career in industry, He was technical director for the Lion Oil Company, and for the Flintkote Company, and a research associate with the Johns-Manville organization.
